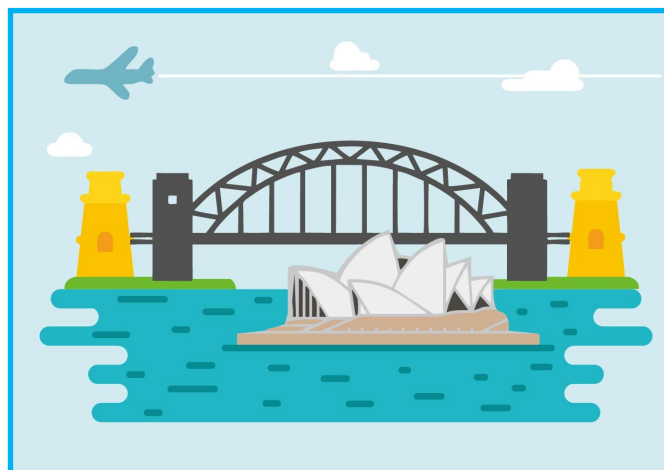
Children's University:

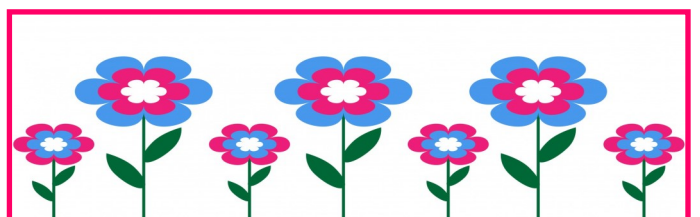
Permission notes and a \$50 deposit are due by the 24th May. Following a payment plan of \$50 per month, will have the excursion paid for by the 24th November.
